Presets

- Presets are used to combine several functions into one
 - Then the Preset can be used on one or a group of photos at a time
 - LR Comes with a lot of build in Presets
 - A Preset is only a Starting Place

Library Area

- To Edit Pre-set (Ex. Naming)
 - Press F2
 - In the File Name dialog box
 - Open File by clicking on the down arrow (right side of dialog box)
 - Select Edit
 - Pre-Set (Ex. Bob's Name)
 - Press down arrow (right side of dialog box)
 - From this point you can Rename or Delete the named Pre-Set

Develop Mode

- Preset Menu on Left side Panel
- If Navigator is turned on
 - If you roll over a Preset, the image will change in the Navigator mode according to the Preset
 - The Navigator gives you a preview
- When you select a Preset I will show how it will modified the slider under the Develop Basic Panel (right side)
- You can tweak the Preset with the sliders
- **Create a Preset**
 - A preset is just a combination of the sliders in the Develop Module
 - Go to the Develop Mode
 - Then go to the Preset Menu on Left side Panel
 - Go to the User Preset
 - Click on “+” sign at the top of Menu
 - A new Preset dialog box will open
 - Check the areas you want
 - Give the Preset a Name
 - Create a special Folder to hold all Presets

- That way you can copy the folder to other Catalogs
 - All Presets created will be stored in this folder for this Catalog
- Start with a clean Dialog Box and build the Preset from there (Check NONE)
- Then select the areas you want
- *Always check Process Versions ?*

- **Automatic Presets**
 - These are Presets that you do over and over again in regards to the Photo (Ex. Naming)
 - It can be an Auto Fix
 - It can be a Landscape Photo
 - Automatically Add
 - Vibrancies and Saturation
 - Sharpening – 90%
 - Masking 25%
 - Camera Calibration
 - Create a Preset for all the above

- **Color**
 - White Balance (Production)
 - Can create a Preset for all variations of White Balance
 - Then in the Navigator Pane, you can roll over each White Balance Preset to see what it will look like.
 - Advantage is that you do not have to change the photo to see the changes
 - Then select the Preset you want in the Develop Module
 - HSL
 - Can control the individual colors
 - Luminance – lets you work with the brightness of a color
 - Split Toning
 - Lets you change the feeling of a photo

- **Vignettes**
 - Start off in the Effects Panel
 - Applied to the darker edges
 - Helps draw the viewer to the center of the photo
 - Use Highlight Priority
 - Select the effect you like

- Click the Toggle Switch to see the before and after effect

- **Organizing Presets**
 - Create a Folder for all my Presets
 - Can drag a Preset to a Folder to Folder
 - Create in Alph. Order
 - Can rename with Number
 - Numbers always move to the top over letters

- **Moving, Saving and Backing up Presets**
 - If you want to know where a Preset is located
 - Select the Preset
 - Right Click
 - Select Show in Finder

 - In Preferences (Edit on Menu Bar)
 - Go to Preset Panel
 - Location – uncheck
 - That way Presets are shared with other Catalogs

 - **Backing Up**
 - They are backed up in the LR Folder
 - If you backup your entire computer, they are backup
 - To get a Preset from a Backup Copy
 - Go to the Presets Folder in the Backup Copy
 - Go to Preference – Presets
 - Show Presets
 - Copy and Paste Folder from Backup Copy to the new LR Folder (replace)
 - Re-start LR

 - **Sharing a Preset(s)**
 - Find the Preset wanted
 - Right Click
 - Export to Desktop
 - Share from Desktop
